Since the start of the UEFA Futsal Cup (The Champions' League of Futsal) it has been won 4 times by a Spanish team (Boomerang 2, Castellon 2), a Belgian team once (Action 21 Charleroi) and by a Russian team once (Dinamo Moscow).

The EUC Futsal has similarly been dominated by a few countries. Novi Sad of Serbia won the first two, beating Croatian opposition in both finals and Ljubljana added to the bad fortunes of Croatian Universities, beating Zagreb in 2006.
