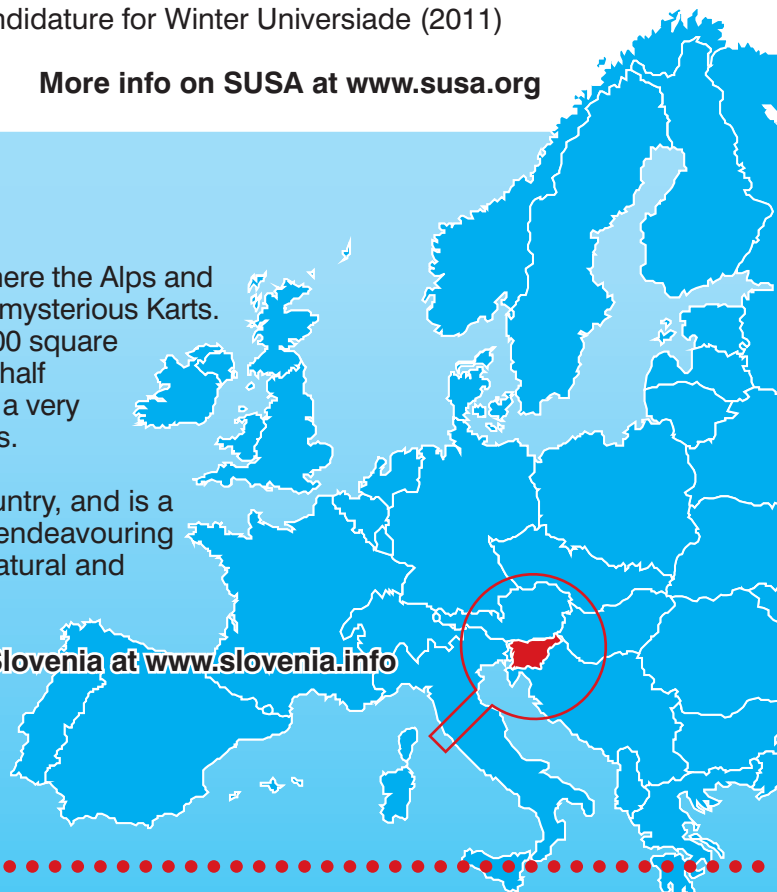
Slovenia

The Republic of Slovenia lies at the heart of Europe where the Alps and the Mediterranean meet the Pannonian plains and the mysterious Karts. A little over 2 million people live here on just over 20,000 square kilometres. Despite being relatively small – Slovenia is half the size of Switzerland – the country has a rich history, a very diverse landscape, and well-preserved natural wonders.

Slovenia is a democratic, stable and independent country, and is a member of the European Union (EU). The country is endeavouring its territorial and national identity and preserving its natural and cultural heritage at the same time.

Maribor

The City of Maribor is the second largest city in Slovenia. It is the economic, university, cultural and sports centre of the north-eastern part of the country. It is located by the Drava River, and at the junction of important traffic routes, so it is easily accessible.

The history of Maribor reaches back to 1164 (with early settlements 2400 B.C.), but the modern Maribor is a city with a university with over 20,000 students. It also has the diocesan seat, many museums, concert and congress centres, shops, famous parks, sports and recreational facilities, etc. The tourism in this area is based on natural heritage, excellent wine and cuisine, and the well-preserved city core which reflects the images of the previous centuries.
